Manningham residents may be eligible for:

- a pension card holder subsidy of \$2,000. Homeowners may also qualify for a Victorian Government rebate of up to \$1,400 and interest free four-year loan of \$1,400 (\$29 monthly repayment).
- a battery subsidy of \$2,000. Homeowners may also qualify for a Victorian Government interest free four-year loan of \$8,800 (\$184 per month repayment).

Congratulations Michele Timms

Manningham's Michele Timms was recently recognised for her tremendous contribution to women's sports, by being inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Michele began her professional sporting career in 1984 at the Bulleen Boomers Juniors program. She went on to play 285 games and win five championships over her 15-year career in the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL).

In 2005, Michele was honoured by the WNBL with the creation of the Michele Timms Cup. The cup is presented to the winner of the Bulleen Boomers verse Dandenong Rangers derby.

Michele's coaching achievements include assisting Head Coach, Tom Maher, in leading the team to their first WNBL Championship victory over the Canberra Capitals in the 2010/11 season.

This latest recognition adds to Michele's growing list of accolades, including:

- a Member of the Order of Australia in the 2018 Australia Day Honours for her significant service to basketball as a competitor at the national and international level
- representing Australia at several World Championships and the Olympic Games in 1988, 1996 and 2000
- being named the Women's International Player of The Year in 1994 and 1996
- receiving an Australian Sports Medal in 2000

We're seeking a diverse group of residents, workers, students – anyone 16+ who receives a invite to join our Community Panel.

Community Panels are an exciting new democratic approach that an increasing number of governments have adopted, to plan ahead. If you want to make a real impact on decisions made by Council, then this is your chance.

How does this work?

- We'll be starting the selection process with an independent company to randomly choose 8,000 addresses across Manningham.
- If you're one of the selected addresses, you'll receive a letter in the mail inviting you to join our panel.
- The letter will include a link and phone number to register your interest.
- From everyone who expresses interest, the independent company will then randomly select a smaller group to form the final panel.
- This ensures a diverse group that reflects the voices of our entire community.

What does the Deliberative Community Panel do?

This panel will play a crucial role in developing our major strategic plans. Through facilitated discussions and learning sessions, you'll help determine key priorities for Manningham and provide recommendations that influence Council decisions.

We will hold several sessions with participants between July 2024 and April 2025. These will be held mainly on weekends, locally. Once the final Community Panel is selected, participants will find out more about how we will all work together.

As it will be a significant commitment involving up to 50 hours, all panellists will receive payment in recognition of their time and commitment.

If your household receives an invitation, anyone aged 16 years or over can apply to participate.

Update on our Regional Assessment Service

The Regional Assessment Service (RAS) is a Commonwealth Government-owned service, operated by Manningham Council that assesses older adults for their eligibility to receive Commonwealth-funded aged care services.

The Federal Budget released in May 2023 indicated that a single combined assessment system would be introduced, and the current RAS service would cease at the end of June this year.

Under the new system, Manningham residents will continue to receive assessment services through new providers. At Manningham, we have been delivering the RAS for many years. However, significant Commonwealth Government changes to the in-home aged care system have resulted in Council making the difficult decision at the March Council meeting, to discontinue as a RAS provider when the contract ends on Sunday 30 June, 2024.

This follows the challenging decision last year to exit in-home aged care services.

Many of you and your families have been assisted by our wonderful RAS team over the years. We would like to acknowledge the work of this small and highly effective team, and thank them for their contributions to the Manningham community

Manningham Council will continue to play an active role in advocating for the needs of vulnerable members of the community to continue to receive high-quality aged care services through our new Healthy Ageing team.

Meet the artist - Grace Dlabik

Grace Dlabik is a Manningham resident and trailblazing interdisciplinary artist.

Over her 25-year career, Grace has been highly sought after for her vision and strategic work in future thinking and community building.

Grace's work has been deeply informed by her Melanesian heritage as she creates connected environments with community care and culture at its core.

Grace was awarded the 2023 Mordant BLAK C.O.R.E Fellowship, during which she led *karu kin*, a project focused on connecting indigenous women and nonbinary folk through clay making. This project informed her upcoming exhibition at the Manningham Art Gallery, titled *kose karu kin*.

We asked Grace about her creative process and the inspiration for her upcoming show.

Tell us about your upcoming show, kose karu kin?

This exhibition is a combination of my own art, titled *kose*, and a special project *karu kin* that I led during my fellowship.

kose is comprised of limestone sculptures that represent pillars of strength in community, kinship systems of care and nourishment. A reminder of who I am, who we are and where we come from and honouring my matrilineal bloodline.

karu kin is the project that speaks to the kinship relationality and ways of connection through gathering and sharing through clay making. This involved seven indigenous women and non-binary people.

Both projects of work use nature as a way of deeply connecting to our culture and the body of work that combines the use of both materials of the earth, limestone and clay.

Tell us a bit about your current artistic practice and what you're currently exploring and making?

My practice is intrinsically connected to my cultural roots from my mother's side who are makers, great orators, voyagers, singers and feasters. I have found myself longing for a deeper connection to this part of myself and have felt called to explore these parts of myself more deeply.

My artistic practice informs the way I am thinking about restorative cultural practices and the continuation of culture through contemporary ways.

Through the yearning for using my body; my hands, and breath – I'm exploring clay making, limestone sculpting, wood carving and printing.

What are some of your first experiences of connecting to art?

I have always been a big dreamer. I remember often laying on the grass in the backyard and drawing imaginary shapes with my hands against the backdrop of the clouds and sky and other times I would draw with sticks into the earth. Such big foundational anchors that have informed my imagination and my art practice today.

I come from the Botai clan of Hanuabuda and the Lavaipia clan of Lese Oali, songlines would be my first memory of sound art – hearing through song and language and then learning traditional dances from Papua New Guinea.

How does living in Manningham on Wurundjeri Country inform your practice?

I am a settler here on Wurundjeri Woi-wurrung Country and often reflect on the inherent care and connection that First Peoples have for the waterways, land and so I consciously and deeply care and respect this land I am privileged to live, create and make art on. I am often creating works in the garden and on the property so immersed in my beautiful surroundings.

I fire my ceramics in toru uta (Toaripi language, meaning dug out hole/fire pit where I also cook kaikai). I use the branches, leaves and wood from the property in respect and honour of making a permanent imprint of place and time onto the pieces which are created through the smoke. I have found that the hole contains limestone which has been a very exciting discovery. I experimented with crushing the limestone and fired it at varying temperatures which changes the colour of the limestone.

Carsharing gains momentum in Manningham

Residents continue to hold the key to carsharing in Manningham, following a successful 18 month trial.

Together with GoGet, we have extended the trial in Doncaster Hill and Tullamore Estate to July 2025.

Carsharing lets you hire vehicles on demand, by the hour or day, without parking hassles when you're done. It's one of the ways we're working to improve our transport network and provide more sustainable, cost-effective options.

Carsharing can help reduce:

- car dependency
- traffic congestion
- parking demand
- greenhouse gas emissions.

Manningham residents joining GoGet value access to a wide range of vehicle types and the ability make trips that are inconvenient by other transport modes.*

As part of the extended trial, GoGet is waiving the monthly membership fee for all Manningham residents.

There are six car share vehicles across Doncaster Hill and Tullamore Estate.

Since the trial began in November 2022:

- GoGet membership increased by 30% in Manningham to almost 600 members
- 200+ metres of street parking has been freed up
- 118.25 tonnes of CO2 emissions avoided in 2023
- 458,000km of private vehicle travel has been prevented.


