Doncaster East

Doncaster East is an established and maturing residential area with a relatively stable population and a range of activity centres. Stockland The Pines not only boasts a selection of major retail outlets, but has a key focus on community development through collaborations with not for profit and community focused organisations. The centre is complemented by The Pines Library and an Adult Education, Health and Wellbeing Centre which provides opportunities for all ages.

Tunstall Square has one of the most extensive ranges of fresh produce, home to a national award winning butcher, a delicatessen and array of eateries. It also features a range of boutique outlets including women's fashion and homewares, plus a renowned florist, major supermarket and professional services.

Donburn Shopping Centre provides dining and take away restaurants in a lively setting, with several real estate firms, a medical centre and a large chemist for shopping convenience.

Doncaster East Village and Devon Plaza are well known for their outstanding customer service and wide range of goods and services. Doncaster Road divides the centre into two distinct sections. This area is also home to many commercial office spaces and professional service based businesses.

Jackson Court is a friendly neighbourhood centre, which prides itself on its independent retailers, personal service, depth of choice and convenient location. The centre has a mix of specialty shops, restaurants and cafés and an ALDI supermarket.

Doncaster East has seen a steady increase in new Australians mostly from mainland China, Malaysia and Hong Kong, who add to the diversity of the community.

This suburb has seen growth in the population, largely couples both with and without children and lone person households.







