Donvale

Development in Donvale commenced with the subdivision of the area south of Doncaster Road in the 1950s. Today, Donvale is an established residential area, including both conventional suburban lots and lower density areas. The population of Donvale is increasing, despite a decrease in the average household size.

While Donvale is not home to a neighbourhood activity centre, there are local activity centres which service residents' shopping needs. Donvale borders Doncaster East with its five shopping precincts as well as nearby Park Orchards. This local community plays an important role in the economic growth of the area.

Donvale has seen moderate population growth (3.5 per cent) and continues to be home to many families, although there has been an increase in lone households over the period. Donvale has the highest proportion of lone person households in Manningham (19.2 per cent).

Donvale has seen a dramatic increase in the number of elderly people (60.7 per cent). This could be due to the number of aged care facilities based in Donvale predominately along Mitcham Road and Springvale Road.

Donvale has good access to major transport routes including EastLink, Public Transport Victoria Smart Bus routes and the Belgrave/Lillydale train line at nearby Mitcham station.






