## **Templestowe Lower**

Situated along the Yarra River, Templestowe Lower gets its name from being downstream from neighbouring suburb, Templestowe. The first European settlement in the area was in 1841. Templestowe is home to Birrarung Park and Finns Reserve, both known for their walking tracks and access to the river.

Macedon Square and Plaza provides convenience and a village atmosphere and acts as a meeting point for the neighbourhood. The centre has two supermarkets and offers a mix of retail and professional services with a wide range of dining options.

Templestowe Lower has seen moderate population growth (3.5 per cent) and is home to many families, although there has been recent growth in lone person households.

Many European immigrants moved to Templestowe Lower in the 1970s and more recently there has been an increase in Chinese migration to the suburb.






